

VOLUNTEER JOB DESCRIPTIONS

<u>Registration</u> – Collect participant paperwork, hand out t-shirts and cruiser vests. Wednesday from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. 4 people, no experience necessary.

<u>Night Hike Leader</u> – Wednesday from 8:00 to 10:00 p.m. 1 person with a background in wildlife biology.

<u>Field Training</u> – Teach students how to use forestry tools, identify basic tree species, and use an identification key. Thursday 8:30 a.m. to noon. 8 people, forestry background helpful but not needed.

<u>Field Trip Assistant</u> – Help students collect data in field, possibly including tree population, size, species composition, basal area, canopy cover, and fuel loading. Thursday 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. 4 to 8 people with a forestry background.

<u>Ask a Forester</u> – Meet with student teams to discuss their solutions to the given focus topic. Thursday 7:00 to 10:00 p.m. 4 to 5 foresters. Must spend about ½ hour reading materials prior to event.

<u>Field Testing</u> – Exam proctors monitor testing stations and keep students on schedule. Friday 8:30 to 12:30 and/or 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. 8 people, no experience necessary.

<u>Test Grader</u> – Grades field test. Friday 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., drop ins OK 3 to 4 people, no experience necessary, but preferred.

<u>Presentation Judges</u> – Listen to student presentations, ask questions after each presentation, and fill out score sheet. Saturday 8:00 a.m. to noon. 12 to 18 people, no experience necessary, but must spend about ½ hour reading materials prior to event.

<u>Presentation Timekeepers</u> - Proctor student presentations, keep track of time, and show flash cards with time remaining. Saturday 8:00 a.m. to noon. 4 to 6 people, no experience necessary.

<u>Photographer/Videographer</u> – Take whole-group and school photos, action photos and videos throughout the event. 1 person, photography experience preferred.
